

# **Getting Medical Help**

1 FOR LIFE-THREATENING EMERGENCIES, CALL 9-1-1
You must also call StudyInsured™ Assistance within 48 hours of a serious emergency.

If you are unable to call, have a reliable person call for you.

2 If your injury or illness is not serious, call StudyInsured™ Assistance first

StudyInsured™ Assistance will help to determine if you require a clinic or a hospital, locate the closest facility, and will help organize payment if you are visiting a direct-billing facility. You can also use the Find A Doctor tool on your student insurance website.

Most illnesses and mild injuries can be treated at a clinic. You should only visit a hospital if your injury or illness is serious.

If you are experiencing severe pain, have a high fever, or think you have a broken bone, call StudyInsured™ Assistance before going to the hospital.

Remember: You must call StudyInsured™ Assistance within 48 hours of a major illness, major injury, or hospitalization for your medical bills to be fully paid.

# 3 Preparing for your medical visit

- Bring your StudyInsured™ wallet card, one piece of photo ID, a claim form, and a method of payment like a credit card.
- If you're worried about your ability to communicate in English, bring someone who can translate for you. There are also apps that can help with translation.
- If applicable, bring a list in English of your medications, allergies, and medical conditions.

Before you leave the clinic or hospital, make sure you have copies of doctor's notes, reports, prescriptions, receipts, and invoices. You will need to submit them to StudyInsured™ to complete your claim.
