MEETINGS School Orientation • Attendance required. • First day of school.

Students paired with student mentor. **Homestay Orientation** Attendance required. Online format. **Homestay Contractor Monthly Meeting** Attendance required. In person at school. Contractor sets and communicates meeting details to students. Discuss homestay, academic and social concerns.

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HOMESTAY

Homestay Tour

- Tour of homestay home, inside and out.
- Most tap water in Canada is safe.
- Remove shoes at the door.
- · Learn recycling vs. garbage.
- Thermostat/temperature use.
- Kitchen appliance use.
- Wi-Fi use.

Family Procedures

- Discuss expectations, rules, schedules.
- Topics: computer use, shower times.
- Exchange contact info and photos with family.

Food

- Eat with homestay regularly.
- Receive varied, nutritional meals and snacks daily.
- Discuss favorite foods, join grocery shopping.
- Talk about missing home country foods.
- Learn about meal preparations, make your own breakfast/lunch.
- Responsible for own snack costs at school.
- Discuss kitchen rules and appliance use.
- Meal provided if homestay absent for dinner.

Bedroom

- Keep bedroom tidy.
- No food/drinks in bedroom without permission.
- Respect privacy; knock before entering.

Bathroom

- Ask if you are unsure how to use bathroom facilities.
- Keep the bathroom clean.
- Provide your own toiletries.
- Keep shower/bath to 15 minutes or less

Laundry

- Follow laundry schedule.
- Learn to use washer and dryer.
- Hosts provide laundry products.
- Computer Access and WIFI



Chores

Clean up after using kitchen/bathroom.

Internet

- Use your own computer.
- Homestay provides internet (no charge).
- Internet off by 11pm.
- Misuse may lead to suspended privileges.

Cell Phones

- Working cell phone required for safety.
- No going out without a phone.
- Require Canadian phone number.
- Students pay for phone expenses.
- · Options: pay-as-you-go or monthly plan.
- No long-term contracts through homestays.
- iPads/apps not sole communication method with homestay.

Curfew

- Sun-Thurs: 8pm (<16yrs), 9pm (≥16yrs).
- Fri-Sat: 11pm for all.
- Regular curfews during holidays/Pro-D days; may extend sometimes.
- Allowed out past curfew with homestay or for school activities.

Sleepovers

- Need permission from homestay and other student's parents.
- Suitable notice required.
- Homestay parents and other student's parents communicate with each other about arrangements.

Damage

- Kootenay Lake School District is not responsible for damage caused by the student.
- Students pay for willful damage, not wear and tear.
- The process involves an ISP, Homestay Contractor, and insurance.
- Study Insured insurance may cover costs where applicable.

LIFESTYLE

Banking

- Homestay helps open a bank account with necessary documents.
- Option to use pre-loaded Visa cards instead.
- Advised against carrying too much cash; use cards.

Job

- Not allowed on study permit.
- May lead to dismissal from school district.

Babysitting

• For safety reasons, students should not babysit.

Pets

- Not responsible for pet care in homestay.
- Cannot have personal pets in homestay.

Dating

- Introducing my partner to homestay.
- No partners in bedrooms.

Drugs and Alcohol

- · Strictly prohibited.
- Immediately sent home if found using/possessing.

Religion

- · Respect each other's religious beliefs.
- Optional church attendance with homestay.

Student Moves


- Contact Homestay Contractor with any issues.
- School district may move students.

Visitors

- Housing for students only, not visiting parents.
- Overnight stays with parents require completing a form, for more than three nights away out of district.

Agents Visits

Must get permission from the International Program to visit homestay.



EXTRA CURRICULUM

School activities

- School pays for basic school fees for core classes.
- Core classes include English, social studies, math, science, career, PE.
- Student may pay fees for athletics, arts, technology classes

Monthly Activities

- The International Program offers free monthly activities.
- Students may have to purchase lunches.
- Sign up with Contractor after discussing with homestay.

School Field Trips

- Optional teacher-organized activities.
- Need parent/guardian signature on permission forms.
- Homestays can sign for low-risk trips, natural parents for high-risk trips.
- Students pay for field trips such as skiing and hiking.

Driving

- No owning, driving, borrowing, or renting vehicles.
- You may only be a passenger in cars when the driver is 25 years.
- Driver must have full license (not an 'L' or 'N' status)
- Driver can be member of their homestay family who has an 'N' status.
- Students may take drivers lessons with permission of natural parents.

Traveling

- Complete travel form 5 days before travel for certain conditions.
- Applies to overnight trips and day trips outside certain areas.

United States

- Complete travel form 5 days before US trip.
- Check visa/ESTA requirements in advance.
- Bring necessary documents for border crossing.

Airport

- Homestay arranges airport transport.
- Discuss flight bookings with homestay.
- Students pay for homestay transport for mid-program trips at a set mileage rate.

School Bus

- Available outside of 3 km from school.
- Homestay's responsibility to register student.

Public Transit

- Students can purchase a city bus pass.
- Travel safely, stay in contact with homestay.

Summer Storage

- \$50/month storage fee if possession in homestay over summer.
- All fees paid before leaving.
- Must pack and clean own space.

Medical Information

- Short-term (<6 months) covered by StudyInsured.
- Long-term (>6 months) initially covered by StudyInsured, then MSP after 3 months.
- Returning students stay on MSP.
- International programs apply for insurance coverage.

Maple Virtual Care

- 24/7 access to doctors via text/video.
- Preferred pricing, no claim submissions.
- Register at getmaple.ca/msh with policy number and DOB.
- Describe symptoms and chat with a doctor, diagnosis or prescription provided.

Hospital Emergency

- For medical emergencies only.
- Notify homestay and contractor immediately.
- Contractor starts claim with StudyInsured.
- Collect and share medical documents (written diagnosis, and follow up recommendations)
- In severe emergencies, call the number on your ID card

Mental Wellness

- 24/7 support through the Stay Healthy at School program.
- Access to English-speaking counselor or one speaking your home language.
- StudyInsured card provided in welcome package
- Always carry StudyInsured and MSP card (keep a picture of the Medical Card on your phone).

Coverage When Traveling Outside Canada

- Covered globally except in home country, limited to 30 days in the USA.
- No coverage in home country unless in a school/training program.
- For emergencies, call StudyInsured toll-free.

Students on MSP - Traveling Outside BC

- Covered for eligible expenses in BC.
- Carry StudyInsured card when traveling outside BC.
- For medical help outside BC, call StudyInsured Assistance.

Vaccinations

Homestay parents cannot sign consent forms; consult Homestay Contractor.

Dental Care

Not covered unless due to an accident.

CULTURE SHOCK

Defined

- Normal reaction to an unfamiliar environment.
- Experiences include excitement, frustration, depression, exhaustion.
- Describes adjustment to unfamiliar surroundings.

Symptoms

Symptoms vary boredom, withdrawal, loneliness, over-sleeping, irritation, body pains, longing for home, criticizing local customs.

Stages

- Honeymoon Stage Positive and curious.
- Irritability and Hostility Feeling differences are inferior.
- Gradual Adjustment More relaxed, balanced view.
- Adaptation of Biculturalism Sense of belonging, sensitivity to host culture.
- Re-entry Shock Home feels different than remembered.


Support

- Talk with homestay or contractor
- Connect virtually with natural parents

Use Stay Healthy School (mental health support service).

Student Responsibilities

- Follow curfew.
- Respect family, belongings, and rules.
- · Keep the bedroom and bathroom tidy.
- No food/drink in bedroom without permission.
- · No dating partners in the bedroom.
- Eat dinner with family at least 5 nights a week.
- Clean up after using the kitchen.
- No alcohol or drugs.
- Pay for willful damage.
- Introduce friends and get permission for guests.
- Inform homestay of whereabouts and plans.
- Respond to all calls and texts.
- Use Travel Permission form for overnight stays.
- Discuss flight plans with homestay for airport transportation.

Homestay Parent Responsibilities

- Provide contact information.
- Provide a clean environment.
- Provide weekly clean bed linens and towels.
- Three meals a day plus snacks, including family meals five times a week.
- Reasonable use of home and utilities with instruction.
- Set reasonable, age-appropriate rules.
- Ensure students are offline by 11pm on school nights.
- Provide a house key/code.
- Offer homework and assignment assistance.
- Responsible for school transportation.
- Contact the school about student absences.
- Not responsible for free airport transportation during breaks.
- Ensure the student's phone has sufficient power.
- Maintain curfew and report violations.
- Assist with medical needs and doctor/hospital visits.
- Inform Homestay Contractor of home changes.
- No hosting of Private and District students simultaneously.
- Ensure adherence to District Rules and contact Contractor if issues arise.
